
### **GIANLUCA AGIUS**

My name is Gianluca Agius, and my background is that of a student and a business owner. I come from a family of photographers as both my grandfathers, as well as father were photographers in their past, but do not let that fool you into thinking I simply got into photography due to them! I also like cars (what my business is based on), love travelling and experiencing the natural world around us!

I am 23 years old, will be 24 in March. I graduated from University of Malta with a Bachelors of Science in Earth systems, which is basically the study of the interaction in the physical, chemical and biological systems of Earth. Today I am running an Automotive Detailing business I started when I was 19 while still studying.

I have been into photography for over 10 years. My main influence was my maternal grandfather, Gino Theuma, who was a photographer himself, although initially I did not have much interest other than knowing my grandfather, and father both were photographers, it later became a form of creative expression for myself.

Slight influences from family in the beginning, then capturing moments with friends as we began



enjoying our free time as adolescences when I got my first high end camera, it then spiraled into something much greater as time went on and I began developing my own styles.


My first camera was a point and shoot Olympus (cannot for the life of me remember the model) given to me as a present for my first Holy Communion. My first 'big boy' camera was a Fujifilm HS20. Today I shoot on a Canon 5D Mark IV.


I never really took any photography courses apart from a simple after school activity offered in Form 1. Everything I know is mostly self taught, or adapting styles from external influences that I liked.

I joined MIPP in 2021 - the workshops and talks that are held really do help open your eyes into other perspectives, the MIPP is really a place one can get constructive criticism from and spend time with likeminded individuals to learn and possibly also pass on techniques, tips and trick otherwise learnt through a lot of experience out in the field.

I never really like to classify myself as taking one genre of photo, as I really do like taking photos of whatever scenario I find myself in, but if I were to say there is one style/genre that I excel the most at, it would definitely be Automotive photography!

I think the number one thing I tell people when they start off is that it is ok if your photos do not look as good as maybe some of the more professional photographers they might follow. It is important to just go out there, shoot as many photos as you want and just have as much fun as you can. Photography is an





Art, and just like any other type of art, everyone develops their own styles over time, so it's just important to go out, have fun and play around with different ideas you have. I also believe it is super important to shoot in manual mode as early on as you can, as you begin to develop your skills in photography and begin to look at scenes while instantly thinking of the right settings for your camera. You need to become one with your camera to really make the most out of it. Oh - and never shoot jpeg. Always shoot RAW hehe.

There are a few photographers I admire, the main one I have been following for years and really have taken an inspiration from, is Ben Brown (@benjam on instagram) a couple of others would be Alex Penfold (@

alexpenfold) and Simon Puschmann (@simonpuschmann) .. but thats just naming a few, as really and truly I take inspiration from things that I see everyday from many different places:)

I hopefully plan to attend courses in sectors of photography that I feel I might be lacking experience in, or want to try explore, a few examples would be architectural photography as well as portrait photography! Choosing 3 favourites from my collection was much harder than I imagined! But here there are:

Something about this photo really stand out for me - it is somewhat difficult to find unique locations in Malta, but when I found this place, I just fell in love with how it makes the car pop out of place, kind of making it look like a computer render.

This is probably my favourite shot in my portfolio for a number of reasons. Although it may not

be perfect, it is the shot I get the most compliments on till this day, it is the one that is the most comparable to professional shots taken for advertisements by car brands (which was my goal here) and just the honour of shooting this car which is the only one in Malta! (as of writing this) a Porsche 911 (992) GT3! Nothing can quite describe the feeling of being in Iceland, and when I went there on a adventure trip with some of my friends in September 2021, I really wanted to make sure I captured the Northern lights. After a long day exploring, being tired, wet and cold I set up my camera at one of Icelands most famous waterfalls, and with the patience of my friend in frame, I set up this shot and took it over a few exposures simply balancing my camera on a rock I found on the river bank!

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
