

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AWARD OF RECOGNITION











MARVELLOUS MALTA WHERE WILD ORCHIDS GROW BY JOHAN SIGGESSON


The first in a book series by Johan Siggesson documenting aspects of Maltese wildlife which are frequently ignored, Where Wild Orchids grow is going to be launched at the upcoming National Book Fair between 3 and 7th November 2021 at the MFCC in Ta' Qali.



MALTESE FACADES - A PHOTOGRAPHIC ANTHOLOGY

The 35th book published incorporating Charles Paul Azzopardi's photography, this book covers 10 years of Azzopardi's documenting of all elements of Maltese vernacular architecture, including doorways, facades, shrines and balconies. Considered the magnum opus of Maltese architectural photography, this book is due to be released by Miranda Publishers end of November 2021, with an innovative cover design and 300 pages packed with colour images.







With the start of a new season in September, we saw the resumption of all MIPP activities, including workshops, photo walks and courses. 
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JOSEPH P. SMITH By Dr Charles Paul Azzopardi

Joseph P Smith, or Joe Smith as he is better known, is 62 years old, married to Charlotte, and has one son, William, a prodigious jazz musician and artist in his own right. Joe is now retired, having retired 3 years ago, giving him more time to enjoy photography, the graphic arts, swimming and reading.

Joe Smith comes from a fine art background, having studied painting and graphic design locally in Malta and in Florence, Italy. In fact, his first two exhibitions locally consisted of semi-abstract paintings and ink washes, and were held at the National Museum of Fine Arts in Valletta in 1980 and 1982, respectively. Joe's journey in photography actually started a couple of years before his first artistic exhibitions, in 1979. He deems it as a natural progression of his innate artistic tendency and his drive to explore this medium in parallel with his painterly endeavours. Having had a lifelong ache to buy a camera, brought on by a recurrent Nikon camera advert in Reader's Digest which he used to read in his childhood, he first bought a Zenit EM, but it was promptly superseded



during a trip to visit family in Canada in 1979, when he bought his first proper camera, a Nikon FM. Spending six weeks photographing in Canada proved to be a start of a love of photography which continues to this day.

Upon his return to Malta, he invested in a couple of introductory courses which continued fuelling his affinity for the medium, while also instigating him to find his own style. He also attended a large format photography workshop at the Royal Photographic Society in Bath in 1991.

His favourite genre is documentary portraiture, with environmental portraiture being his strong horse, as Joe likes to put the human condition in full evidence. He also enjoys architectural photography for its use of lines and patterns, as well as performing arts, especially jazz. His inspirations in photography are myriad, with Robert Frank being a strong



candidate - a favourite image of Joe's is the image of Frank's shot in London in the 1950s, seen below. Robert Frank's documentary style imparts pathos and strong feelings towards his subjects and his definitive tome "The Americans" ranks as a classic in this genre in Joe's eyes.




Joe Smith joined MIPP from the first days it was founded. From its inception, MIPP organised many important seminars with local and visiting practitioners, who imparted a lot of knowledge, mostly through hands-on workshops. The way Joe sees it, photography is a recording tool and it is important to think outside the box and find the road to exploration and artistic realisation.

One has to know when to break away from the act of simple recording to a more soul-searching exercise. The ease of making images can be the downfall of upcoming photographers if a deeper study of the medium is not undertaken. This is an important lesson Joe would like to impart to budding photographers.

Joe's interest in the graphic arts, particularly printing processes, is still very strong, and now with ample time on his hands, he is following a course in etching and other printing techniques. He is also actively pursuing and finalizing the release of his second book, Survivors.

Despite Joe winning myriad awards for his photography, including the prestigious Taylor Wessing prize at the National Portrait Gallery in London, Joe remains down to earth and always amenable to a word of advice and a helping hand.

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

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
